

Behaviour

Technology


- Phones and iPads etc are permitted, but anything you take with you, you take at your own risk
- Feel free to have your own travel insurance to cover these objects



Money

- Euros and Pounds
- The amount is up to you, but all you **NEED** to buy is lunch each day. Possibly €120 euros as €30 a day is more than enough
- More money will be needed in DISNEY than other days if you would like to buy souvenirs

- Each day at or after breakfast we will have “the bank”.
- You can decide how much money you want to give your child each day.
- This will ensure that your child never has “too much” money on them at once.





Medications

- If your child needs medications throughout the trip you **MUST** let myself and school know. They must be prescribed.
- They should come with a detailed list of their Medicines and specific instructions on when and what needs to be taken





Terrorism Advice

- Each member of staff will carry an attendee list with all participant details, including medical conditions and next of kin contacts.
- All Students will have a printed emergency contact card with the school's Emergency number on it, and space provided for them to write down their own home landline number.
